



Consultations by sector

The citizens' voice

Organized by sector, the consultations allowed for discussions in sub-groups in order to deepen the recommendations and opinions specific to the boroughs crossed:

- May 27 | St-Léonard and Montréal-Nord
- Rosemont-La-Petite-Patrie June 1 (Assomption)
- Rivières-des-Prairies- Pointe-aux-June 3 **Trembles**
- June 8 Mercier-Hochelaga-Maisonneuve west of Highway 25 and Sainte-Marie
- Ville-Marie (Downtown area) June 10 I
- June 16 I Mercier-Hochelaga-Maisonneuve east of Highway 25 and Ville de Montréal-Est

The process' three stages

- 1. Opening plenary led by an experienced and neutral facilitator.
- 2. Sub-group discussions of up to 20 people led by experienced neutral facilitators. Discussions were documented by note takers. Citizens were able to prioritize topics for discussion.
- 3. Closing plenary led by an experienced and neutral facilitator with feedback on the discussion groups.






