INVITATION TO COMMENT ON THE REHABILITATION OF SPANS 2, 3, AND 4 OF THE CN-WELLINGTON BRIDGE, LACHINE CANAL, MONTREAL.

Transport Canada's Navigation Protection Program administers the *Canadian Navigable Waters Act.*

In accordance with requirements of the *Canadian Navigable Waters Act*, InfraRAIL Inc. hereby gives notice that an application has been submitted to the Minister of Transport for the following works.

Common Project Registry Number: 13823

Navigation Protection Program File Number: 2023-309591

The project involves repairing the bridge and the installation of temporary structures (platform and safety boom). The work will be carried out in two main phases. Starting in mid-May 2026, the South channel will be closed to navigation, but navigation will remain possible via the North channel for the entire season. The worksite will then progress to move to spans 3 and 4. The North channel will be closed to navigation in spring 2027 while the South channel will remain open for navigation with work completion scheduled for September 2027.

Worksite location: Located over and on the Lachine Canal, Peel Basin (Reach No. 2), at approximately 45° 29' 27.70" N, 73° 33' 22.35" W, CN-Wellington Bridge, lot 6 352 693 cadastre of Québec, Montreal, Province of Québec.
